ROTARY is an organization of business and professional persons united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help build goodwill and peace in the world.

ROTARY is the world's first service club. The first Rotary Club was founded in Chicago, IL on February 23, 1905 by a lawyer, Paul Harris, and three of his friends. Weekly meetings were "rotated" among the founders.

ROTARY is some 1.2 million service-minded men and women belonging to over 31,000 Rotary clubs in 166 nations around the world.

ROTARIANS meet weekly for fellowship and interesting programs dealing with topics of local and global importance. Membership is by invitation and reflects a wide cross-section of community representation.

ROTARIANS plan and carry out a remarkable variety of humanitarian, educational, and cultural exchange programs that touch people's lives in their local communities and our world community.

ROTARY is the Rotary Foundation, that each year provides some \$90 million for international scholarships, cultural exchanges, and humanitarian projects, large and small, that improve the quality of life for millions of people.

Each member of the Club is expected to attend regular weekly meetings and is required to attend 60% of meetings each quarter. Members can attend or make up meetings at any Rotary Club in the world.

Each member is required to pay annual dues and expected to support Club activities and projects.

To encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST—the development of acquaintances as an opportunity for service;

SECOND—high ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD- The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life:

FOURTH- The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

• **Vocational** Service

Putting high standards of good conduct into practice in Rotarians' business and professional lives.

• Community Service

New Generations Service

Recognizing the positive change implemented by youth and young adults through leadership development activities, involvement in community and international service projects, and exchange programs that enrich and foster world peace and cultural understanding.


What Rotary Means

The Rotary Club of Canton

Youth Exchange - Each year, our Rotary Club hosts an inbound exchange student from a foreign country. For the past several years, we have often sponsored an outbound student to another country.

Citrus Fruit Sales - Club participates in an annual fundraiser for scholarships, as well as other projects.

Tech Student of the Month - Club honors a CHS student each month during the school year

Scholarships - Club awards annual scholarships to Graham Hospital School of Nursing, SRC nursing students, and through an SRC Foundation grant.

Boys State/Girls State – Club supports a CHS boy to Boys State and Girl to Girls State each year for leadership training.

Polio Eradication - Club supports Rotary International efforts to eradicate polio from the face of the earth.

Donations - to a variety of community organizations, including: the YMCA, the YWCA, United Way, and several others.
